On Time

I have a friend Ryan, who was concerned that he was going to be late for an appointment due to traffic. He may make it, but he might be 5 minutes late. So, out of courtesy, he calls the office. The office told him that they understand, but they have a 15-minute grace period, and if he was not in the office in time, he would be charged for the appointment and a new appointment would need to be scheduled. What??? This is the same office where we sit and wait for 30 minutes past our appointment, that they texted, emailed, and called to be sure we will be on time. I call BS, and I am asking you to call it to

My dentist, Dr. Strickland, has never, ever, missed my appointment time. That team values others above themselves, and every time they are on time, I mention that, as proof that it can be done. I think it is time that we stand up for our time and respect and be proactive about our appointments, and call the office, text the office and email the office before our appointments to let them know our expectations and hold them accountable. We must be sure that we are not hypocrites, and we are being respectful of others, and being on time. Right? Make sure our house is in order before we start throwing stones, so to speak.
